<b>Grant</b>	Queensland Government - 2023 Anzac Day Trust Fund COVID-19 Grant Program
<b>Funder</b>	Queensland Government - Department of Justice and Attorney-General
<b>Areas of Support</b>	The 2023 Anzac Day Trust Fund COVID-19 Grants Program (COVID-19 Grants Program) provides funding to veterans' organisations that have directly supported veterans and their dependents affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The COVID-19 Grants Program also assists veterans' organisations impacted by COVID-19 restrictions and supports veterans' organisations to deliver COVID Safe commemorative events. Payments from the Anzac Day Trust Fund COVID-19 Grants Program are reimbursements of eligible expenses incurred by an ex-service organisation in any of the following years, 2020, 2021 and 2022. Eligible organisations who have not previously applied or received funding for an eligible expense in Rounds 1 or 2, may apply in Round 3 of the COVID19 Grants Program, irrespective of the year in which the expenses were incurred.

The proposed research project must add to existing understanding of veterans' health and wellbeing, in areas including: veteran suicide and mental health issues; drug and alcohol use; prevention, treatment, rehabilitation and intervention for veterans' health issues (e.g. management of service-related chronic pain); promotion of veteran resilience; support for transition from the Australian Defence Force (ADF); impacts of ADF service on veterans' partners and family members.
