<b>Funder</b>	Department of the Premier and Cabinet (QLD)
<b>Areas of Support</b>	The primary objective is to improve support for the veterans' community through improved infrastructure for eligible organisations. Program outcomes: improve the use of facilities accessed by veterans and their families, by addressing safety and accessibility; expand the range of uses of a facility to attract new members or users; improve efficiencies in operation of the facility, improve financial sustainability or enable the purchase of equipment.

<b>Grant</b>	Queensland Remembers – Minor Capital Works Grants Program
<b>Funder</b>	Department of the Premier and Cabinet (QLD)
<b>Areas of Support</b>	The primary objective of the program is to improve support for the veterans' community by improving existing building infrastructure and funding the purchase of equipment for eligible organisations. Program outcomes: improve the use of facilities by veterans or organisations that support veterans by addressing safety, accessibility, amenity, layout and other facility issues; expand the range of uses of a facility for veterans or organisations that support veterans and/or help to attract new members or users of the facility; improve facilities by enabling efficiencies in operation of the facility, improving financial sustainability or enabling the purchase of equipment.
<b>Application Deadline &amp; Notes</b>	Round three applications will close 5pm, Tuesday 3 October 2023.
<b>Grant Value</b>	\$1,000 - \$50,000

<b>Funder</b>	Department of the Premier and Cabinet (QLD)
<b>Areas of Support</b>	The primary objective is to assist eligible organisations to deliver commemorative activities and events and create or refurbish war memorials, avenues of honour and memorial gardens. The program will achieve the following outcomes: increase support and recognition for the veterans' community; increase awareness of the local service history of the community; improve the experience for people visiting memorials or attending commemorative activities and events; leave a legacy for future generations.

<b>Funder</b>	Queensland Government Office of Liquor and Gaming Regulation - Gambling Community Benefit Fund
<b>Areas of Support</b>	Provides funding to community groups and not-for-profit organisations in Queensland to enhance their capacity to provide services, leisure activities and opportunities for Queensland communities. The committee prioritises GCBF funding applications in this order, where 1 has the highest priority. 1: items/facilities directly affected, damaged or destroyed by a declared natural disaster in the last 2 years. 2: equipment or facility improvements. 3: buses, cars, caravans, boats, tractors, trailers, large mowers, motorbikes and similar items. 4: community events, training, workshops, festivals, publications and website development. 5: Organisations that have received more than \$15,000 from the GCBF within the last 2 years.
<b>Application Deadline &amp; Notes</b>	Round 119 closes 31 October
<b>Grant Value</b>	Grants between \$500 and \$35,000.
<b>Application Process and Relevant Links</b>	All organisations must be registered to apply for GCBF funding. You can only register once for each legal or sponsored entity—duplicate registrations are ineligible. <b>Grant</b>	Perpetual Trustees 2024 IMPACT Philanthropy Application Program
<b>Funder</b>	Perpetual Trustees
<b>Areas of Support</b>	Perpetual's IMPACT Philanthropy Program distributes to all sectors including social welfare, health, medical and health research, conservation and environment, education, arts and culture and animal welfare. Funding is provided for a wide range of developmental stages, including (but not limited to) pilot and existing projects, capacity building and support for early career researchers. Submissions will be assessed against the following

	criteria: Strategy, Outcomes, Capability, and Leadership. Funding is generally provided as a single year, one-off grant.
<b>Application Deadline &amp; Notes</b>	Funder advises: "applications open: Monday 30 October to Friday 8 December 2023" and "Resources for the 2024 program will be available on 23 October, prior to the opening of applications"..
<b>Grant Value</b>	Maximum request is \$120,000, though grants are generally between \$10,000 and \$100,000, with the average grant being \$75,000 in recent years

<b>Grant</b>	Saluting Their Service Commemorations Program - Community Commemorative Grants and Major Commemorative Grants
<b>Funder</b>	Australian Government Department of Veterans' Affairs
<b>Areas of Support</b>	Funding to preserve Australia's wartime heritage and to involve people throughout the nation in a wide range of projects and activities that highlight the service and sacrifice of Australia's service personnel in wars, conflicts and peace operations, and promote appreciation and understanding of the role that those who served have played in shaping the nation. Community Commemorative Grants are available for local, community-based projects and activities. Major Commemorative Grants are for projects and activities that are significant from a national or state/territory perspective.
<b>Application Deadline &amp; Notes</b>	Batch 1 - closes 9:00 pm AEST 13 June 2023; Batch 2 - closes 9:00 pm AEDT 10 October 2023; Batch 3 - closes 9:00 pm AEDT 6 February 2024.
<b>Grant Value</b>	Two levels of funding: Community Grants: up to \$10,000; Major Grants: up to \$150,000
