
Colonel Commandant RACT—South Queensland Region

BELLBOWRIE MEMORIAL UPDATE

Another matter that many of you will have been following in previous newsletters is the planned memorial in Booker Place Park, Bellbowrie to remember CAPT Ian Kerr and CPL Neville Hourigan who died serving others during flood relief operations at Bellbowrie on 28 January 1974.

The memorial design, (featured in the last newsletter) has now been signed off by Brisbane City Council. Dennis Scanlan advises the Council has appointed a landscape company to undertake the landscaping work for the memorial, and in conjunction with the sculpture creator, have started work which is expected to be completed by Christmas.

The memorial, as illustrated below, will feature a LARC V made from triple steel with the LARC V image made from stainless steel. The memorial will remember the supreme sacrifice of CAPT Ian Kerr and CPL Neville Hourigan and a QR code attached to the memorial will direct people to the Moggill Historical Society Website where the story of the incident is explained.

It will be unveiled by the Lord Mayor at a public ceremony at Booker Place Park, Bellbowrie on Sunday 28 January 2024, commencing at 1100.



WO1 ("50 Cal Al") Alan Murdoch Memorial Junior Leadership Award

In his speech at the event, Marc Baumback described Al Murdoch as someone who had 'an elite magnetism and influence on soldiers and officers of all Corps' and that they elected to create a Junior Leadership Award in his honour, for soldiers serving in 5SQN as it was one of his most favoured units.

Marc added that Al 'was a tenacious, focussed, empathetic and highly professional soldier. He was respected universally for 'living' the professional beliefs, actions and mindsets that define Army's values. He led, he influenced, he gave counsel and he acted always with conviction and belief. His humour and positive mindset were contagious and at times, annoying and disarming when times were bad.

He believed that leaders and great soldiers existed at all levels; that they simply wanted to be challenged: and that to achieve that they needed to fed with situations, opportunities, aided by encouragement, inspiration, empathy and a distinct sense of purpose.'

The award is a depiction of an established and respected statue, titled 'The Driver' that resides at the Shrine of Remembrance in Melbourne. In the last two newsletters, members were made aware of the WO1 ("50 Cal Al") Alan Murdoch Memorial Junior Leadership Award and were able to read a little about Alan Murdoch who sadly passed away on 22nd October 2021. Information was also provided about the RACT 50th anniversary event at which the inaugural award was to be presented.

It is unfortunate that access restrictions limited attendance, but Lionel Rose has reported (as has BRIG Cris Anstey in his COL COMDT report in this newsletter and previously in person at the ATA Christmas lunch) that the event was a great success and well attended by Al's family members, friends and those who had served with him.


CHRISTMAS LUNCH
