<b>Areas of Support</b>	The program is designed to provide funding for projects that promote appreciation and understanding of the experiences of service and the roles that those who served have played, and to preserve, add to the sum knowledge on, or provide access to information about Australia's wartime heritage. There are 2 categories of grants: Community Grants - available for local, community-based projects and activities; Major Grants - available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or broader regional perspective.
